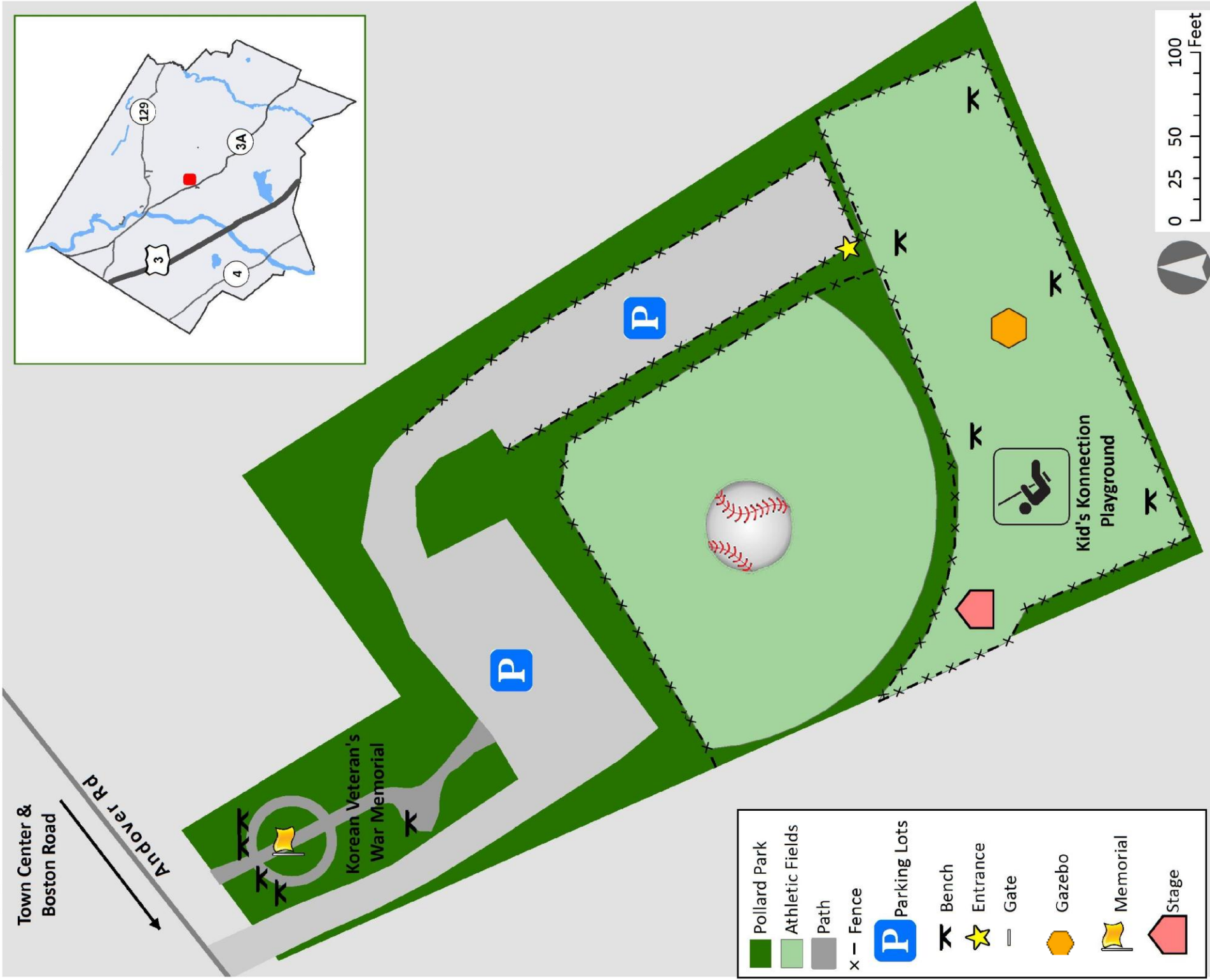

History

Pollard Park was named after the Revolutionary War resident, Asa Pollard, the first soldier killed at the Battle of Bunker Hill (1735-1775).



The **Korean Veteran's War Memorial** was opened in 2001 as a tribute to six Billerica veterans who lost their lives during the Korean War. It recognizes the contributions and sacrifices made by all Billerica residents who served in that war. Those six veterans are Donald M. Carmichael, Wallace Ritter, Albert W. Vaillancourt, Robert J. Farthing, Richard Brouillette, and Fredrick P. Selfridge.

The Korean War, also known as the "Forgotten War", raged on from 1950 until an armistice ended the fighting on July 27, 1953. It came on the heels of WWII and was followed by the Vietnam War. It is often overlooked by historians and Americans alike. More than 52,000 American lives were lost; while over 104,000 soldiers were wounded. More than 8,100 are still missing.
