Warren Manning State Forest is located off of Chelmsford Road (Rt. 129) in Northern Billerica.

Head north on Boston Rd (Route 3A). Take a left onto Chelmsford Road and the park entrance is about .35 miles down the road on the right.







### **History**

Warren Henry Manning (1860–1938) was an influential American landscape designer and a key figure in the formation of the American Society of Landscape Architects, along with a proponent of the National Park System.

During his career, Manning worked on more than 1700 projects including a number of park designs, private estates, city planning, college campuses, subdivisions, golf courses, and government and community projects.

Warren Manning was a champion of the American style of landscape architecture who left his mark on our country through his private and public commissions. We are truly the benefactors of his dream of "making America a finer place in which to live."

This state forest which is located in Billerica, on land he donated, is named for him.
