You are hereby authorized and requested to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Billerica qualified by law to vote in Elections and Town Affairs, to meet at the Maurice A. Buck Memorial Auditorium, Town Hall, 365 Boston Road, Billerica, MA on Tuesday, October 1, 2024 at 7:00 PM and subsequent Thursdays and Tuesdays until all of the business in the Warrant shall have been acted upon, then and there to vote on the following articles:

ARTICLE 1 - TO APPOINT ONE MEMBER TO THE BOWERS FUND COMMITTEE

To see if the Town will vote to appoint one (1) member to the Bowers Fund Committee.
This appointment is for a term of five (5) years; or act in relation thereto.

Finance Committee recommends approval.

Article 1 Explanation: The Bowers Fund Committee was established in the late 1800's when the Bower sisters left their entire estate to the Town of Billerica, approximately \$11,000, with the express intent of assisting the poor of Billerica. The current expendable balance in the fund is \$11,200.22 and the principal balance is \$150,085.37. The Town Meeting appoints members to the Bowers Fund Committee. Committee member Michael Rea's term is expiring in October of 2024 and he is requesting that he be reappointed for another 5-year term.

ARTICLE 2 - TO HEAR REPORTS OF TOWN MEETING COMMITTEES AND OFFICERS

To see if the Town will vote to hear and act upon the reports of Town Meeting Committees and Officers; or act in relation thereto.

Article 2 Explanation: This article provides an opportunity to hear and act upon reports of Town Meeting Committees and Officers.

ARTICLE 3 - TO AMEND THE START DATE OF TOWN MEETING

To see if the Town will vote to amend the start date of the Annual Spring Town Meeting as allowable in the Town of Billerica's General By-Laws, Article I, Town Meetings, Section C; or act in relation thereto.

Submitted by the Town Manager; authorized by the Select Board

Finance Committee recommends approval.

Article 3 Explanation: The Select Board made a policy decision in May of 2023 that they would allow Town Meeting to vote on amending the start date of the Annual Town Meeting if needed. Pursuant to the provisions of G.L. c. 39, sec. 9, notwithstanding the provisions of the By-Laws or Charter to the contrary, the Select Board may on its own vote to delay an Annual Town Meeting. Such delay by the Select Board is not subject to action by Town Meeting. This article is non-binding and requires approval of the Select Board.

At this time, no reason exists to delay the Annual Spring Town Meeting.

Article 4 Explanation: Town Building Insurance, Town Electric, and Health Insurance were level-funded and needed to be adjusted after the renewals of contracts. Fire Department Overtime was not adjusted for the cost-of-living increase during the last budget cycle. The Town has also had multiple buyouts and retirements and that account needs to be increased.

ARTICLE 5 - TO VOTE A SUM OF MONEY FROM FREE CASH TO THE DEBT STABILIZATION FUND

To see if the Town will vote to transfer and appropriate the sum of \$1,800,000 from General Fund Free Cash to the Debt Stabilization Fund; or act in relation thereto.

To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$12,000,000 to pay for the purchase of land, design, engineering and construction of a New North Billerica Fire Station, including the payment of all costs incidental and related thereto; and that to meet this appropriation the Treasurer, with approval of the Select Board, be authorized to borrow the sum of \$12,000,000 under and pursuant to the provisions of M.G.L. Chapter 44, Section 7, and or any other enabling authority; and further, to authorize the Select Board to execute such documents and enter into such agreements as it deems in the best interest of the Town in the furtherance of the objectives of this article; or act in relation thereto.

Article 14 Explanation: This article is to fund the construction of a New North Billerica Fire Station. In the Fall of 2022, the Town conducted a structural assessment of the North Billerica Fire Station. In the 2018 Department and Facility assessment of all Billerica Fire Stations, it noted that the North Billerica Fire Station exterior wall, floor and roof were rated extremely poor. It was also showing signs at the time that the concrete flooring had significant wear.

ARTICLE 15 - TO TRANSFER AND APPROPRIATE A SUM OF MONEY FROM THE OPIOID SETTLEMENT STABILIZATION FUND TO FUND VARIOUS OPIOID-RELATED ITEMS

It will also allow the Town start fresh and eliminate outdated information, old links, etc.

Article 25 Explanation: This article proposes to approve funding for installation of an insertion valve including replacement of the existing butterfly valve on the finished water main at the Water Treatment Plant.

ARTICLE 26 - TO FUND A SPACE NEEDS FEASIBILITY STUDY AND DESIGN FOR THE CURRENT POLICE STATION

To see if the Town will vote to transfer and appropriate from General Fund Free Cash the sum of \$200,000 to fund a Space-Needs Feasibility Study and Design for the current Police Station to be spent under the direction of the Town Manager; or act in relation thereto.

Finance Committee recommends approval.

Article 26 Explanation: This article will fund a space needs analysis and design work for the Police Department. Currently, the Police Department has large areas of underutilized space while other areas have grown and are unable to accommodate demand. Women's locker rooms are undersized, Shift Commanders have very little space, the briefing room is oversized, paramedic sleeping quarters abut the prisoners, dispatch has vacated the first floor and records is dispersed throughout the building. A comprehensive look is needed especially with the introduction of POST and accreditation.

ARTICLE 28 - TO VOTE FROM FREE CASH TO THE STABILIZATION FUND

ARTICLE 31 - TO FUND, DEDICATE AS PARK LAND, AND ACCEPT GRANTS FOR THE OLD DITSON PROPERTY

To see if the Town will vote, pursuant to the provisions of Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 45, Section 14 and as it may hereafter be amended and other Massachusetts statutes relating to recreation, as follows:

- (a) To raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds or borrow pursuant to any applicable statute the sum of \$800,000 to be spent by the Town Manager to construct a public park and recreational opportunities by making repairs, modifications and expand open areas as described in plans on file with the Office of the Town Clerk, with respect to presently Town owned land called the Ditson land located at 793 Boston Road, in the Town of Billerica, being Assessors map No. 99, lot No 96, block No 0, consisting of 2.93 acres more or less;
- (b) To vote to transfer pursuant to Chapter 40, section 15 of the General Laws, the presently town owned Ditson land described as 793 Boston Road, Assessors map No. 99, lot No 96, block No 0, consisting of 2.93 acres more or less, to the jurisdiction of the Town of Billerica Select Board in its capacity as the Board of Billerica Park Commission which capacity is established by virtue of the Town of Billerica Charter, section 3-2 “The board of selectmen shall have all of the executive powers given to boards of selectmen by general law or otherwise” and Chapter 45, section 2 of the General laws, which provides: “in a town which has not elected a board of park commissioners or has not authorized the town planning board so to act, the selectman shall act as such board of park commissioners ... and shall have all other powers and duties of a park commission”;
- (c) To vote to dedicate the Ditson land heretofore described now and forever as parkland for public use, as a park, and a recreational facility, to be named “Old Ditson Park or such other name for the Park as the Select Board may from time to time establish”;
- (d) To authorize the Select Board to issue a Declaration of Dedication of the Ditson land as a public park such Ditson land as a public park, for park and recreational purposes, to be now and forever maintained under the jurisdiction, care and statutory responsibilities required of the Billerica Park Commissioners in Chapter 45 of the General Laws, and to authorize the Select Board to record such Declaration of Dedication of such Ditson land as a public park in the Middlesex Registry of Deeds;
- (e) To authorize the Select Board, on behalf of the Town of Billerica, to file such applications for grants as deemed advisable under any applicable grant funding source including but not limited to the Urban Self-Help Act (see 301 CMR 5.00); and

- (f) To authorize the Town of Billerica Select Board to enter into all agreements and execute any and all instruments in the name of the Town of Billerica as may be necessary or advisable to accomplish said parkland project.

Or act in relation thereto.

Article 31 Explanation: This article proposes to dedicate Ditson Park as parkland protecting it from development and maintaining its usage for recreational activities in future perpetuity through the Article 97 process. Provided, however, that said Screening Committee may, by a four- fifths vote of the full membership, waive the requirements of education in whole or in part based on special and unique municipal management experience beyond the five year minimum otherwise required.

20.5 Additional Qualifications: In addition to the general qualifications required for appointment to the office of Town Manager, as provided in Section 3 – 3 (a) of the Charter, the qualifications required for the selection of a candidate for the position shall include the following:

A. That he or she shall have a master's degree with a concentration in public administration, public affairs or public policy and two years' experience in an appointed managerial or administrative position in a local government or a bachelor's degree and 5 years of such experience

That he possess at least an earned Bachelors Degree from a recognized, accredited college or university; and such other requirements as the Screening Committee, established under 3-3(a) of the Charter above may additionally require. fifths vote of the full membership, waive the requirements of education in whole or in part based on special and unique municipal management experience beyond the five year minimum otherwise required.
